

A perfect storm of record days without measurable precipitation and 100 + MPH winds in the foothills of Colorado made December 30, 2021 the costliest day on record for wildfires. This photo was taken from my home. The fire is 25 miles away. Over 1200 houses and businesses were burned to the ground in a single night.

What made this particular fire so devastating was that it started in the foothill of the mountains and spread east into one of the most populous areas in the entire front range. Within a matter of hours, 2 cities were completely engulfed in flames. Putting out the fires was just the beginning of the long recovery effort which could take months or years. To many I have already spoken to, the recovery process has proven to be more painful and chaotic than the fire itself. To help in this process I have been involved in a few areas. First, many people do not think about all the animals effected by the fires. A good majority of the fire spread through open prairies and farmland before reaching the cities. There were several hundred cattle and horse farms destroyed. I am friends with a local cattle farmer who is leading an effort to relocate and feed livestock. This is a huge undertaking both physically and logistically.

Another area I am involved in, is helping another good friend who owns a realtor group. Immediately after the fires, the group collected 7 truckloads of relief supplies for immediate use such as basic toiletries, clothing, blankets sheets and pillows. They also led an effort to find immediate temporary housing. People were volunteering their unused rooms, basements and travel and motor homes for use. Since that time we have been working to find more permanent housing while insurance claims are being made to rebuild. This situation has become one of frustration and sadness. This particular area was already in the midst of a housing shortage even before the fires. Houses for sale lasted on average 4 days on the market. Now, unfortunately, the demand is so high for housing, both rental and sale, that prices have risen astronomically. For instance, a very modest house rented for \$2000-\$2500 6 months ago, now that same house is renting for \$4000 – \$4500 per month! There are many who have been forced to move away, and the fortunate few who are lucky enough to have family close are still living with them.

Please join me in prayer for meeting the physical needs of the people effected and hopefully this will lead to addressing their spiritual needs.
